Debi stated that Trillium will update the Charter to reference the decision to go with Cochairs. Sharif Maddox asked if we could clarify the terms but was later satisfied with the description in the Charter once Debi went over that section. Adam Freer asked for clarification on the CAC's role with the CHP report, Debi mentioned that we will review that section and update the charter for the CAC's review. Debi found a couple of typos that will be corrected Instead of voting to approve the charter at this time it was decided that Trillium staff would make changes to the charter and send the revised document back out for the CAC's review **Demographics** Courtney Johnston provided the CAC with an overview of the upcoming Demographics Survey including why we will be sending it out, what the survey entails, and a timeline of Survey when to expect the survey. Washington County \$30,000 Washington County will develop a community education campaign to combat stigma related to substance use with the goal of encouraging community members to seek treatment.
