- 1. Call Meeting to Order** – Meeting opened by Caitlynn Hatteras, Co-Chair.
- 2. Public Comment:** No public comment
- 3. Introductions and Welcome** – Caitlynn Hatteras, Co-Chair. Get to know you question: What is your favorite summer fruit or vegetable?
- 4. CCO 2.0 Update** – Report by Amanda Cobb, Trillium
The Oregon Health Authority has awarded CCO status beginning January 1, 2020 to two health plans: Trillium and Pacific Source. CCO's are not allowed to send clients marketing materials. The Oregon Health Authority will send out a page of information on each CCO to members. There is information on the OHA website to help members to decide which of their providers are covered by which plan. October through November, members will be assigned to a CCO based first on who their BH provider is contracted with and then to which plan their primary care provider is contracted with. The Oregon Health Plan said that members will be assigned fairly 50/50. January – October, 2020, during open enrollment, members can change CCOs if they don't like the CCO

they have been assigned to. Amanda will bring materials to the CAC that the OHA will be sending to the OHP members. We will have a new CEO, Chris Hummers, starting soon.

5. Reports

Prevention – Report by Tara DaVee.

Discussed the Quit Tobacco in Pregnancy program and looked at the data from 2015 – 2018 to determine how we are doing. The program is through the WIC Program. Women are given gift cards when they quit tobacco in pregnancy that they can use how they want minus the purchase of tobacco and/or alcohol. Tobacco use in pregnancy has been reduced in the OHP population. We just got the okay to do a quality improvement project on the Q-TIP program.

CAP –

The CAP discussed impact of 2.0 on OHP members. Provider community has concern about how to best serve their patients with two different plans. Discussed how the OHA raise their communication game. We also looked at data on childhood obesity and chronic pain assessment. We have seen a rise in childhood obesity even in the very young. The effects we will see downstream is diabetes, hypertension, joint disease, body image, etc.. We looked at ways that we can partner to combat this issue and decided supporting programs like CATCH in the public school system and farm to table double up food bucks. We looked at the dollars being spent in dealing with chronic pain issues. We have a dramatic increase in people getting into substance use treatment, behavioral health support and non-medical pain intervention. We are also seeing less people with chronic pain going to the emergency department.
