



**CCO Advisory Councils
Report to the Governing Board
November 2015**

Community Advisory Board:

The Community Advisory Council met on November 23 at Lane County Youth Services. A representative from NAMI announced that NAMI was looking for bilingual volunteers. They are trying to increase their ability to reach individuals and families affected by mental health issues in Latino communities.

The “getting to know you” introductory question was “what is your favorite Thanksgiving tradition or memory?” Debi Farr gave the Trillium report. There was a discussion about OHP renewals and problems consumers were experiencing. Debi answered questions and offered to send information about the OHP hotline and where to find Application Assistants in Lane County. Debi mentioned that Trillium had participated in the very successful Health Fair at Centro Latino Americano.

She also shared the names of groups who were awarded the Transformation grants: Centro Latino Americano, Cornerstone Community Housing, Daisy CHAIN, Mid Lane Cares, Peace Harbor Hospital Foundation and Willamette Dental.

Rick Kincade reported from the CAP. They are reviewing the CCO Incentive Metrics and planning their strategies for next year.

There was a report on the Community Health Assessment (see above.)

The remainder of the meeting was focused on the next stages of creating a vision and mission for Trillium.
