- 1. Call Meeting to Order Meeting opened by Tara DaVee.
- 2. Public Comment: No public comment
- **3.** Introductions, Welcome, and Getting to Know You Activity People introduced themselves and answered the question: "What food did you try that you didn't think you'd ever try but did and actually liked it or food you would like to try"?

4. Opioid Panel

Dr. Luedtke , Lane County Health Officer– Opioid Epidemic in Lane County: (see attached presentation).

- Methadone stays in system for 24 hours or more if liver is damaged.
- Naloxone Program five lives have been saved from dying of an overdose since August. Twice as many have been administered.

- Marijuana is a schedule 1 drug which means we can't do research on it because the research has no use.
- Marijuana used to come in 1-5% pure grade marijuana. Now you can get 20-50% pure THC marijuana.

Dr. Thomas Wuest, Trillium's Chief Medical Officer – Trillium's Approach.

- The emergency rooms have been very involved in rerouting dental pain cases to dentists.
- We have a Quality Improvement Model for Dental Health.
- By not prescribing opioids or reducing prescription amounts, we are trying to reduce opioid deaths and addictions.
- We need to have tapering programs in place by 2018.

Jennifer Webster – Prescription Drug Overdose Project

- The Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) is a gold piece in keeping patients from getting multiple prescriptions from various doctors.
- The drug Fentanyl cut with Heroin is more potent and causes more deaths. Heroin is also being cut with Vicodin.
- Opiate withdrawal will not kill you. You may feel like you want to die because you are withdrawing and you desperately want to feel that high again.
- The Veteran's Administration (V.A.) in Medford is the largest VA drug inpatient/outpatient facility in the country.
- We aren't affecting change yet in getting naloxone in the pharmacies.
- All providers have to be registered with PDMP to be certified.
- Trillium is sending out a general letter to all members who have been prescribed opioids for pain.
- Trillium has two detox facilities for 1-2 day detox/treatment for their Trillium members. We also have many contracts with treatment facilities around the state. Trillium members who want to receive treatment should call Trillium to inquire.
- Many older adults on pain management don't see themselves as being addicted.
