1. Call Meeting to Order – Meeting opened by Caitlynn Hatteras, Co-Chair.

2. Public Comment: No public comment.

- **3. Approve Minutes**: Minutes from the November 26, 2018 meeting will be approved at our next meeting.
- **4.** Lane County Biennial Mental Health and Addictions Plan Discussion Presented by Leah Edelman. What is working in the behavioral health system?
 - CAHOOTS is now coming to Florence.
 - Secure MH transport that is more humane and not handcuffed in a police car.
 - Bethel School District is contracting with CAHOOTS for intervention and counseling Source and Strengths Training for staff.
 - Increased capacity for methadone and buponorfin for treatment.
 - Increased education and distribution of NORCAN.
 - Flu shot education and outreach.

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- Ride share has improved.
- Wait time has been cut to see a provider.
- Peace Health has Behavioral Health Nurse Practitioners.
- Increase in OHP application assistance.
- Increase and strong presence of mental health providers for people with addictions in Cottage Grove.
- Planning process opened up to a broader audience.
- Trillium in conjunction with Food for Lane County has expanded the Produce Plus Program to rural areas.
- Oakridge has added mental health services to the Orchid Clinic.

What needs to be improved? Where are the gaps?

- Codependency issues not addressed.
- Same day transport for people in crisis.
- Transport for walk-in clinic.
- Crisis services for individuals with developmental disabilities.
- Follow-up care is like a revolving door after a crisis, especially when discharged from the State Hospital.
- Lack of residential inpatient care.
- Need a Community Health Worker or Social Worker to help.
- More suicide intervention and training capacity.
- More training for the community / faith for suicide prevention and how to get connected to emergency services.
- Pediatric inpatient care.
- Crisis training for emergency responders from people who experiences mental health issues.
- Need to increase peer support.
- Mental Health needs not met because of physical health challenges.
- Stigma of having mental health issues. Need to change the system.
- Need more public awareness of suicide issues by addressing in the media.
- Emergency Department has long wait times so people in crisis give up and leave.
- There is no transportation for people to non-medical activities.
- Need housing for people with mental health issues.
- Mental health clients are tagged as drug seekers when trying to get Rx.
- Need community or home based services.
- Need Geriatric Specialists.
- Lapse in care at the jail.
